RE: **NOTICE OF CUT-OFF DATE FOR CERTAIN HERBICIDES APPLIED BY AIR**

Per Title 3 California Code of Regulations Section 6464:

March 16, 2017 through October 15, 2017:

No application, **Ground or Air**, of RESTRICTED phenoxy herbicides [2,4-D, 2,4-DB, 2,4-DP, MCPA] shall be made on any area situated within two miles of any cultivated commercial vineyard or cotton planting belonging to any person other than the owner of the property being treated unless there is a continuous air flow away from such planting, but in no case shall any application be made within one-half mile of such plantings. (The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to Dicamba or Propanil herbicides.)

March 16, 2017 through March 31, 2017

No application shall be made by air, nor shall aircraft be loaded, except as follows:

-during the period beginning March 16 and continuing through March 31

(The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to Dicamba or Propanil herbicides.)

In Tulare County, crops that are considered to be sensitive to damage from these herbicides include, but are not limited to, **COTTON, SUGARBEETS, TOMATOES, VINES (KIWI and GRAPE)**, and **DECIDUOUS TREEFRUIT** with evidence of bud break. Also considered to be sensitive to damage is **NEWLY PLANTED ALFALFA**.
