COMMENTS

Acreages

- 1. Citrus acreage increased by 7,242 acres over 1965.

 Navels accounted for 5,461 acres of this increase
- 2. Considerable acreage increases are shown in the following deciduous tree crops.
 - a. Almonds increased 576 acres
 - b. Prunes increased 379 acres
 - c. Walnuts increased 474 acres
- 3. Decreases in acreages are noted in
 - a. Table grapes, down 715 acres
 - b. Raisin grapes, down 393 acres
 - c. Freestone peaches, down 423 acres
 - d. Plums down, 722 acres
- 4. Total Revenue increase \$51,379,000 or 15 8/10%
- 5. Field Crops: (Revenue up slightly)

Reasons: Cotton acreage and revenue down, but was offset by increases in alfalfa hay and field corn.

6. Seed Crops: (Down)

Reasons: Less acreage planted to seed crops.

- 7. Vegetable Crops: (Down \$464,000)
 - Reasons: a. Potato revenue down 21 1/2% because of price.
 - b. Small increases in most other vegetables helped hold this loss to a minimum.
- 8. Fruit and Nut Crops: (Up 33 1/2 million)
 - Reasons: a. Citrus production and price up.
 - b. Table grape production up with some varieties up in price.
 - c. Raisin production up.
 - d. Olive production and price up.
 - e. Prune production and price up.
- 9. Nursery Products: (Up \$600,000)

Reasons: a. Production of more citrus and deciduous fruit and nut trees.

10. Livestock & Poultry: (Up \$13,803,000)

Reasons: a. Increase in numbers of cattle

b. Increased production of broilers & fryers.
