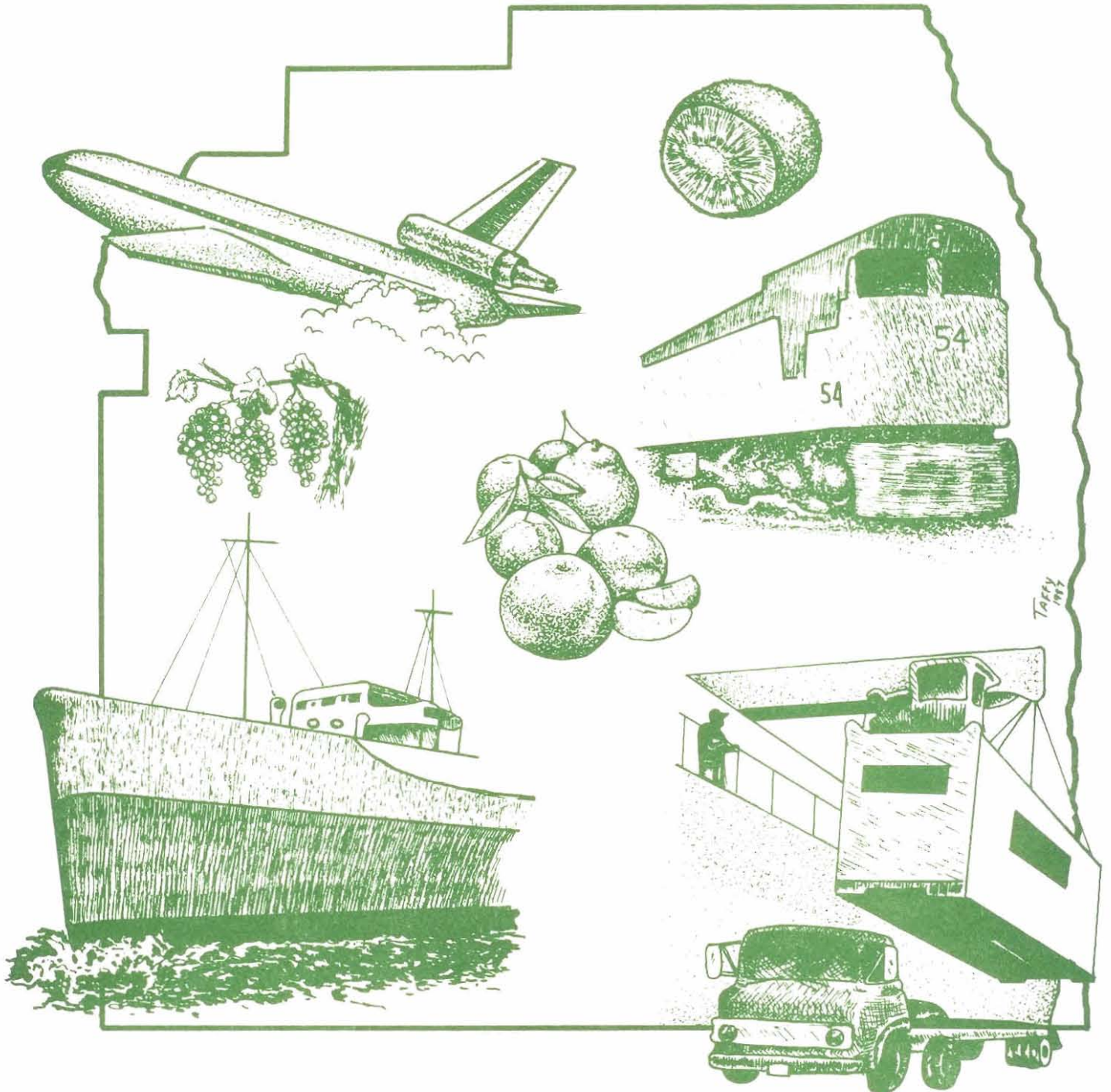

THE EXPORT MARKET

This year's annual crop report cover graphically illustrates the interaction between Tulare County agriculture and the international marketplace.

Tulare County producers have responded to the unique challenges of global marketing in a way that provides a dependable supply of fresh, high-quality agricultural products to countries throughout the world. Not only do we export to the more traditional world markets such as Japan, Europe, Canada and similar countries, but it's not uncommon for a product from Tulare County to be found in such diverse locations as Tahiti, Venezuela, the Mariana Islands or Saudi Arabia.

Conducting business on such a wide-ranging scale means that local producers and shippers must adapt to the needs of the more than 90 foreign countries that were shipped to in 1986. The Agricultural Commissioner's office conducts approximately 7000 inspections annually in order to help Tulare County exporters be certain that their commodities will meet the quarantine and other requirements established by these countries. This export program helps facilitate the rapid delivery of our agricultural products while at the same time maintaining California's credibility as a shipper of only the most wholesome and highest-quality agricultural products.

Exports of Tulare County products include not only our top five products: oranges, dairy products, grapes, cotton and treefruit, but also more than 35 other commodities from almonds to wheat seed. The gross value of these exported commodities has been estimated to be in excess of \$100,000,000 in 1986.

The many producers, packers, shippers and those associated with the agricultural industry of the county are to be congratulated. Their efforts have made Tulare County what it is today...one of the leading producers of agricultural commodities in the state, the nation, and the world.

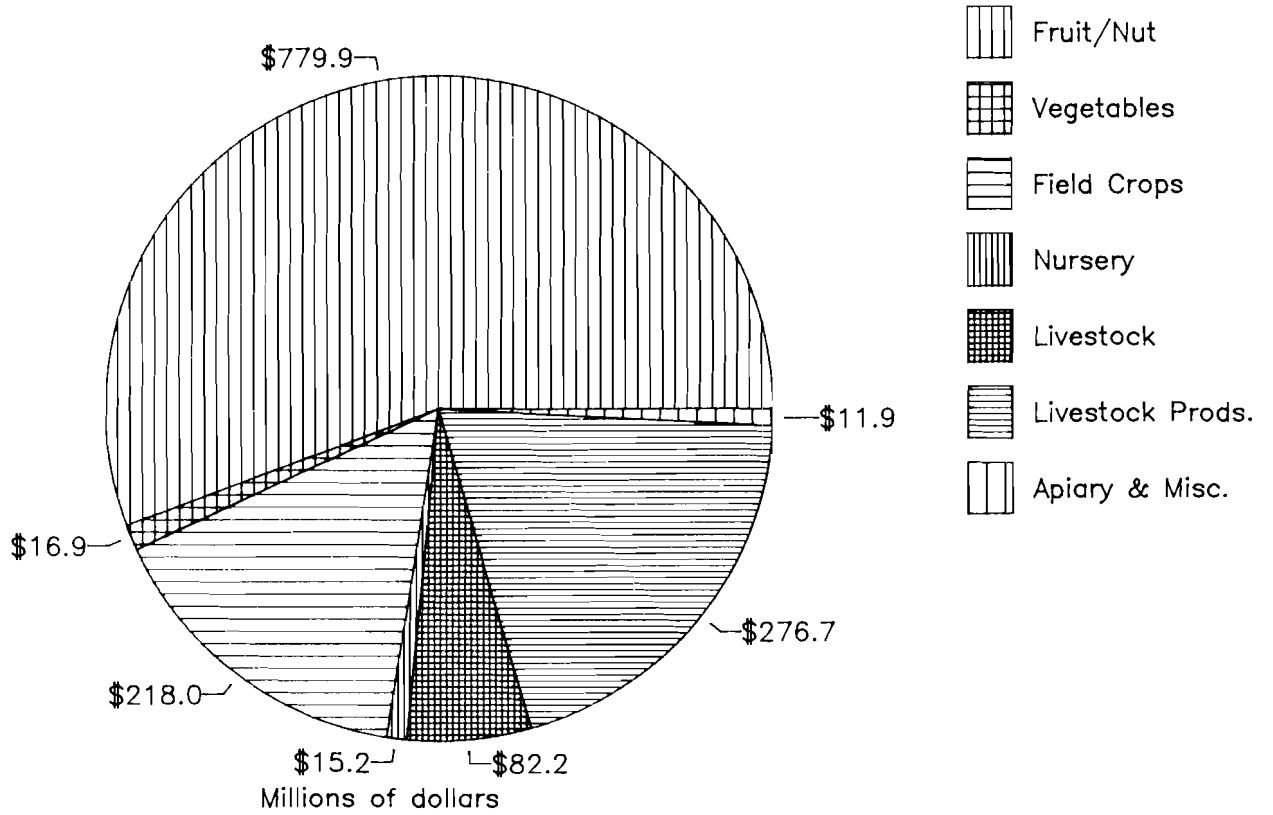

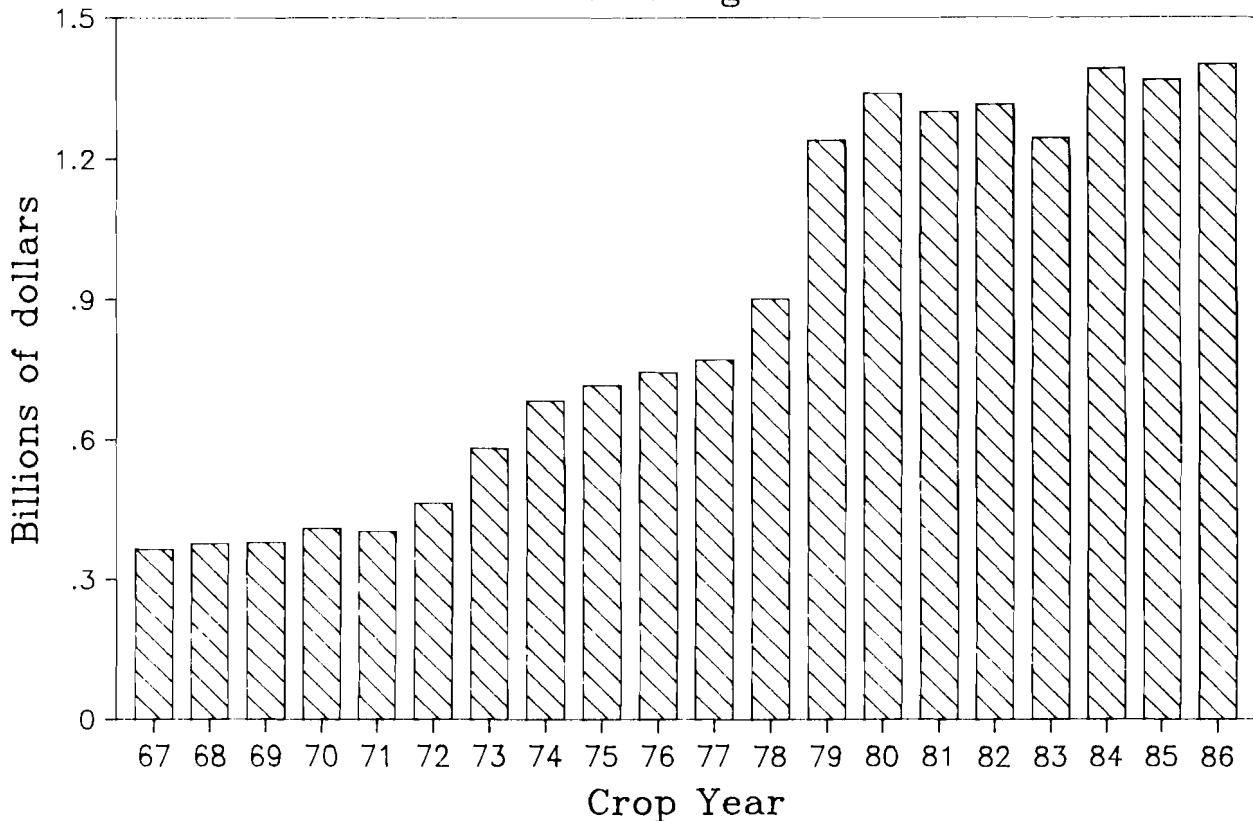
