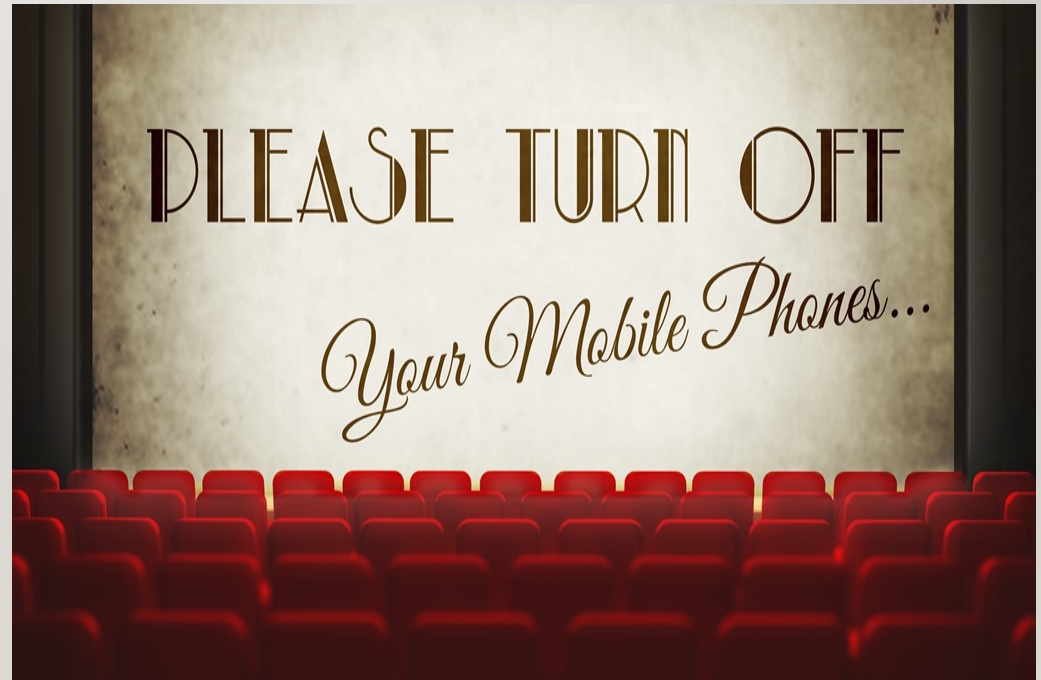
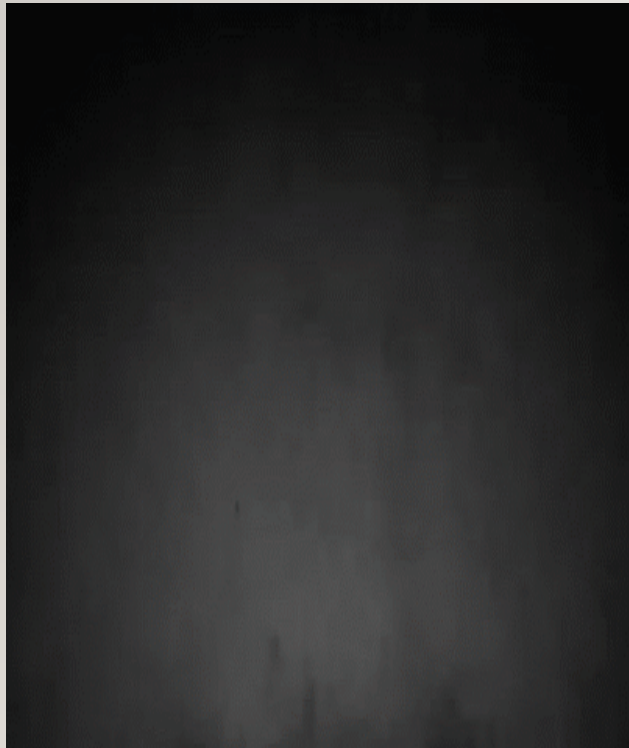

- ❑ If you are short CE hours, after December 31, 2021, you will have to take the re-certification test.



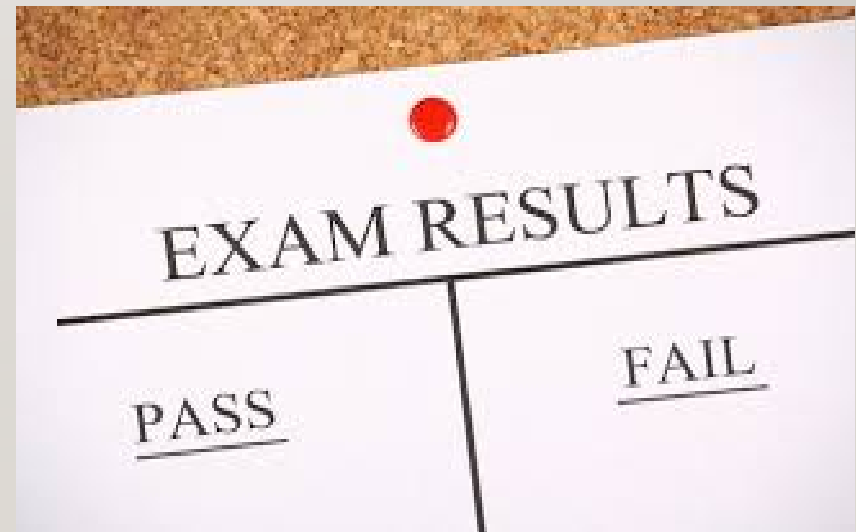

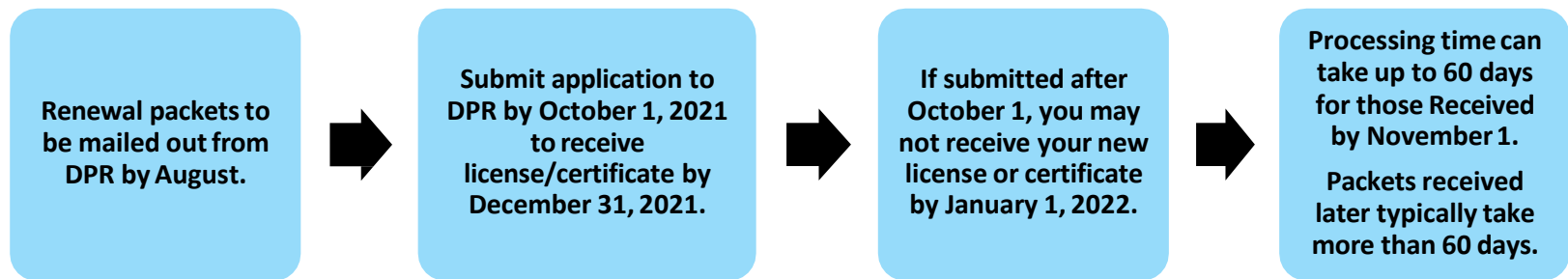

# Are Your CE Hours Valid?

---

CE hours must be taken **during the valid period** listed on your license or certificate.

Check your dates: the **valid period** is from the **'date of issue'** until the **'expiration date'** listed on your card.



**No** grace period to obtain needed CE hours after December 31.



**No** excess hours can be transferred to the next renewal period.

# ALTERNATIVES AND MITIGATIONS FOR RESTRICTED MATERIALS

## ONLY FOR RESTRICTED MATERIALS PERMITS

To: Tulare County Restricted Material Permit Applicants\*

Title 3, of the California Code of Regulations (CCR), section 6426 requires the permit applicant (grower) and his/her pest control adviser to consider alternatives to the use of a restricted material before receiving a restricted materials permit. While this specific requirement is directed at agricultural use, the general requirement to consider alternatives applies to all permits. To determine compliance with this requirement, we are asking you, the permit applicant, to identify the alternatives that you considered.

**Title 3, CCR section 6426 Alternatives and Mitigation Measures.**

(a) Each licensed agricultural pest control adviser and grower, when determining if and when to use a pesticide that requires a permit, shall consider, and if feasible, adopt any reasonable, effective and practical mitigation measure or use any feasible alternative which would substantially lessen any significant adverse impact on the environment. NOTE: Authority cited: Sections 11456, 14005 and 14102, Food and Agricultural Code.  
Reference: Sections 11501 and 14006, Food and Agricultural Code.

\*Applicant is required to complete and submit a new form when adding additional restricted materials to the permit. This form is considered valid until any changes to restricted materials are made to the permit, either by supplement or renewal.

## EXAMPLES OF ALTERNATIVES

(Alternatives to Restricted Materials)

### **Consider Nonchemical Alternatives**

Beneficial insects; encourage natural predators/enemies  
Learn to recognize common predators such as ladybugs, syrphid flies, and lacewings. If you see them in abundance, you may want to postpone any treatments to see if these natural enemies will solve problems for you.  
Parasitoids, Microscopic Pathogens, and Grazing Animals

### **Consider Mechanical/Manual Alternatives**

Mowing, disking, or hoeing to cut up weeds.  
Trapping to control rats, mice, voles, moles, gophers, and some insects.  
Sanitation (remove unpicked fruit, mummy nuts, weeds, and dead limbs etc.)

### **Consider the Use of Physical Controls and Exclusion**

Copper strips to keep slugs and snails away from plants. Caulk to plug pest entry holes in buildings, or  
Sticky barriers to keep ants out.  
Fabric row covers to exclude insects and birds.  
Weed control fabric to suppress weeds.

### **Consider Cultural Practices**

Choose proper plants for the climate. Choose pest and disease resistant varieties.  
Cover crop/Mulching to reduce weed growth

## EXAMPLES OF MITIGATION

(Reducing the adverse effects of Restricted Materials)

### **Use Less Pesticides**

Use pesticides in "spot" treatments, where and when they are needed.

### **Use Proper Timing; Regular Monthly or Bi-monthly Spraying Wastes Pesticides.**

In addition, during many of these treatments, pests may not be present or present in numbers so small that they are causing no problem. For some pests, treatments must be timed to coincide with a period in their lives when they are most vulnerable.

### **Use Integrated Pest Management (IPM)**

Determining the number of pests that can be tolerated without causing unacceptable damage or annoyance. Pests are treated only when they reach the threshold.

### **Use Less Toxic Pesticides**


Non-restricted pesticides, Biochemical Pesticides

### **Use of Application Technology**


Selection of application equipment to minimize drift of restricted materials. Airplane vs. helicopter vs. ground sprayer should be considered based on the crop, coverage needed and weather conditions.

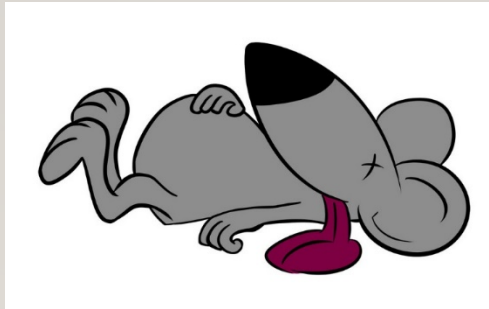

# 6626. PESTICIDE USE REPORTS FOR PRODUCTION AGRICULTURE.

## Who needs to Report the Use of Pesticides?

(a) The **operator of the property** which is producing an agricultural commodity shall report the use of pesticides applied to the crop, commodity, or site to the commissioner of the county in which the pest control was performed. This report must be **submitted by the 10th day of the month following the month in which the work was performed.** This report is not required if the pesticide use is reported to the commissioner by pest control business as specified in subsection (b); however, the operator of the property treated, shall retain a copy of the business' "Report by Site" for two years.

(b) An **agricultural pest control business** shall report the use of pesticides applied by it for the production of an agricultural commodity to the commissioner of the county in which the pest control was performed. This report must be **submitted within seven days of completion of the pesticide application**. A copy of the report shall be sent by the business to the operator of the property where the pest control was done within 30 days of completion of the pesticide application.

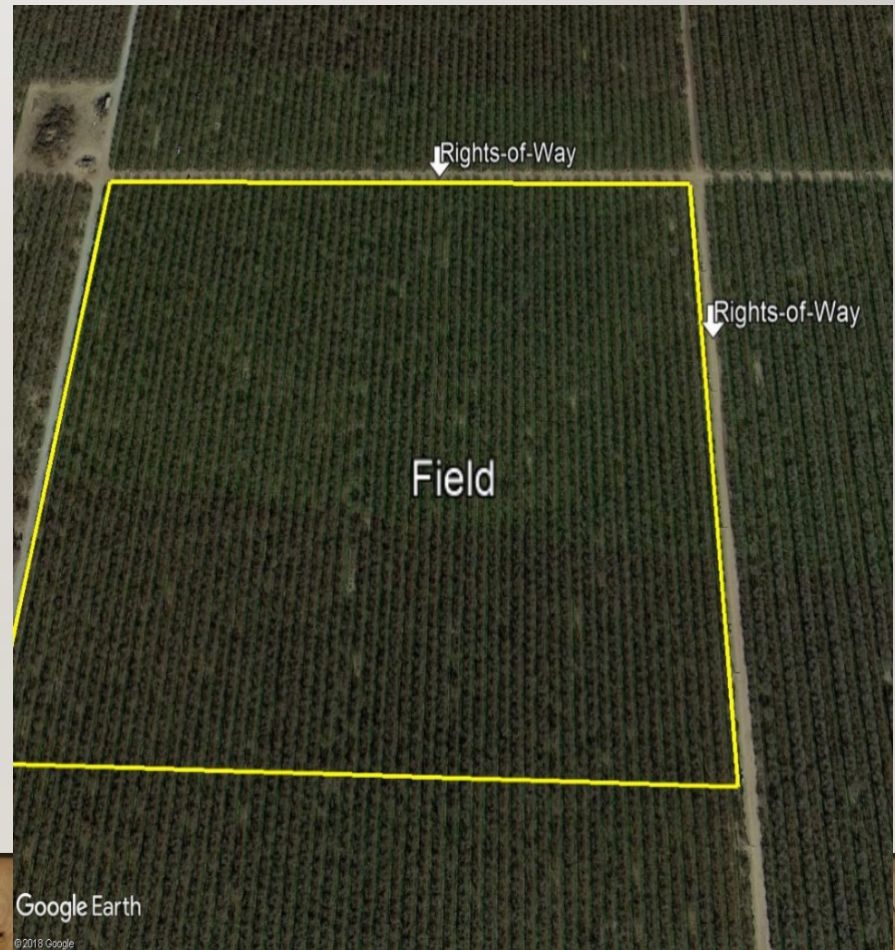

# MAINTENANCE GARDENER

If you **occasionally** apply pesticides as part of maintenance gardening business, you have three requirements:

## Maintenance Gardener (Subcategory Q)

This category allows you to apply or supervise the application of general use\* pesticides, substances, methods, or devices that is incidental to your commercial maintenance gardening activities in:

- Outdoor ornamental and garden areas surrounding public structures, such as buildings, brick walls, fountains, fences, statues;
- Outdoor ornamental and garden areas surrounding commercial parks, such as, offices, restaurants, warehouses, factories, stores, shopping centers, malls.
- Parks, golf courses, cemeteries, but only on ornamental or turf plantings near buildings (clubhouses, pro shops, restrooms) that are distinct and separate from the plantings that constitute open space landscaping in a park, golf course or cemetery itself.

- A Maintenance Gardener QAC in category Q from DPR.
- A **Maintenance Gardener** Pest Control Business License from DPR.
- Register your business in the counties where you intend to work.



# MAINTENANCE GARDENER

---

If you apply pesticides as part of maintenance gardening business, you have three requirements:

- QAL in category B from DPR.
- Pest Control Business License.
- Register your business in the counties where you intend to work.

<b>Landscape Maintenance (Category B)</b>	
<p>This category allows you to apply or supervise the application of restricted and general use pesticides, substances, methods, or devices to control pests in:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Natural or planted ornamental and turf landscaped areas and other outside areas around buildings;</li><li>• Residential yards (including home gardens and orchards), recreation areas, schoolyards, vacant lots, storage yards, greenbelts, golf courses, cemeteries, parks, landscaped street medians, sidewalk areas and walkways, and parking lots directly related to landscaped areas;</li><li>• Landscaped areas in enclosed shopping malls and indoor plants.</li></ul>
<p>This category does not include direct application to running or standing water.</p>

# Pesticide Use Near Schools Notification

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## Addressing Pesticides Used Near Schools and Child Day Care Facilities

California Code of Regulations, Title 3, sections 6690–6692



Effective January 1, 2018:

- Regulations apply to pesticide applications made for the production of an agricultural commodity within ¼ mile of public K-12 schools and licensed child day care facilities, except family day care homes (collectively referred to as schoolsites)
- Pesticide application restrictions will apply Monday through Friday, from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., within a specified distance of a schoolsite:
  - Two types of restriction distances: ¼ mile (1,320 feet) or 25 feet, depending on the type of application equipment used and type of pesticide applied (some application types are prohibited by labels or do not occur)

Application Equipment Type	Minimum Distance to Schools by Equipment and Pesticide Type

Airblast Sprayer	¼ mile	Prohibited	Doesn't occur	¼ mile

\*Backpack sprayers that incorporate an airblast sprayer to apply "other" pesticides are prohibited within ¼ mile.

- Exceptions to application restrictions: The prohibitions do not apply if school classes are not scheduled for the day of application or the child day care facility is closed during the entire day of the application. This allows applications during the day on holidays and school breaks
- An option for an agreement between a schoolsite, property operator, and County Agricultural Commissioner with alternative application restrictions that provide the same or a greater level of protection as provided by the prohibitions
- Field fumigations within ¼ mile of a schoolsite must be completed at least 36 hours before the start of classes
- An annual notification by property operators to schoolsites and County Agricultural Commissioners by April 30 that includes contact information and a list of all pesticides expected to be used within ¼ mile of a schoolsite during July through June
  - A new grower (through purchase or lease of a field) must provide the first notification within 30 days of assuming control of the property
- CalAgPermits is the suggested method that property operators use to develop and submit the notifications

## ADDRESSING PESTICIDES USED NEAR SCHOOLS AND CHILD DAY CARE CENTERS



California has adopted regulations that address agricultural pesticide applications near public K-12 schools and licensed child day care centers (collectively referred to as schoolsites). These regulations provide minimum distance standards for certain agricultural pesticide applications near schoolsites and require annual notifications to schoolsites. The goal is to reduce the chances of unintended pesticide exposure to children and increase communication between growers, County Agricultural Commissioners, and schoolsites.

### WHO

**Schoolsite Administrators**  
 Receive annual pesticide use notification from nearby growers  
**County Agricultural Commissioners**  
 Enforce the regulations and answer questions  
**Growers**  
 Follow pesticide use restrictions during set days and times, and provide annual pesticide use notification to Schoolsite Administrators and County Agricultural Commissioners

### WHAT

**Pesticide Use Restrictions**  
 Within ¼ mile of a schoolsite, growers cannot make certain types of agricultural applications on Monday through Friday between 6:00 am to 6:00 pm. Some exceptions apply, such as when a schoolsite is closed for the day.  
 Requests to extend restriction days and times, like during extracurricular activities on the weekend, can be handled through a written agreement between the schoolsite, County Agricultural Commissioner, and grower. The written agreement must achieve the same or greater level of protection as the regulations.

**Annual Pesticide Use Notification**  
 Growers must provide written, annual notification of all agricultural pesticides that may be used on fields within ¼ mile of a schoolsite. There are no exceptions.

Included in the notification will be:  
 • Map of field and schoolsite  
 • List of pesticides that may be applied  
 • Contact information for grower and County Agricultural Commissioner

Pesticides not on the annual notification may be used as long as the grower amends the notification at least 48 hours before use.

### WHEN

The new regulations take effect on January 1, 2018. Annual pesticide use notifications must be sent to schools by April 30 of every year beginning in 2018. A new grower, through purchase or lease of field, must provide pesticide use notification to schoolsites within 30 days of assuming control of the property, and by April 30 for subsequent years.

**Contact your local County Agricultural Commissioner's office for questions and additional information.**

### HOW

Schoolsite Administrators will have access to a website to verify schoolsite boundaries and to view the annual pesticide use notification(s) provided by grower(s) within ¼ mile of the schoolsite. If the boundaries of the schoolsite are incorrect, Schoolsite Administrators can redraw them in the website. The County Agricultural Commissioner will review and approve any changes. Using this website will make it easier to receive annual pesticide use notifications from nearby growers.

# TOP 10 PESTICIDE VIOLATIONS OF 2020



# 2020 Violations

- ❖ The Department of Pesticide Regulation (DPR) suggests reviewing this presentation of common violations and the current pesticide laws and regulations to help ensure you are in compliance:
- ❖ Laws are found in Divisions 6 and 7 of the Food and Agricultural Code (FAC)
- ❖ Regulations are found in Title 3 of the California Code of Regulations (3 CCR)
- ❖ This list is in order from the **least common (#10)** to the **most common (#1)** violations





# Important Terms

- ❖ **“GROWER”** is shorthand for “operator of the property applying pesticides for the research or commercial production of an agricultural plant commodity”
- ❖ **“DISPLAY”** is to make required information available to an employee so the employee may readily see and read the document during normal business hours, without having to make a request of any person and without being hindered or impeded
- ❖ **“TREATED FIELD”** is a field (or enclosed space, such as a greenhouse) that either has been treated with a pesticide or had a restricted entry interval or entry restricted period in effect within the last 30 days

**Handler Training**

## “Handling a pesticide” means:

- ❖ Mixing, loading, transferring, applying (including chemigation) or assisting with the application (including flagging) of pesticides
- ❖ Maintaining, servicing, repairing, cleaning, or handling equipment that may contain pesticide residues
- ❖ Working with opened (including emptied but not rinsed) containers of pesticides
- ❖ Adjusting, repairing, or removing treatment site coverings
- ❖ Incorporating (by mechanical or watered-in means) pesticides into the soil



## “Handling a pesticide” definition continued:

- ❖ Entering a treated area during any application or before the inhalation exposure level listed on pesticide product labeling has been reached or greenhouse ventilation criteria have been met
- ❖ Performing the duties of a crop advisor, including field checking or scouting, making observations of the well-being of the plants, or taking samples during an application or any restricted entry interval or entry restricted period listed on pesticide product labeling
- ❖ Other handling activities specified by the label





## 3 CCR §6724 (b-e)

- ❖ Training must cover all required topics and pesticides handled
- ❖ Training must be in a manner the employee can understand
- ❖ Training must be at a location reasonably free from distraction and the trainer(s) must be present throughout the presentation
- ❖ Training must be updated to cover any new pesticides handled
- ❖ Trainings must be recorded and be verified by employee's signature.
- ❖ Employers must keep records for 2 years and provide them to employees upon request

# 3 CCR §6761.1

- ❖ The grower must display application-specific information (ASI) at a central location detailing:
  - ❖ The crop or site treated and identification of the treated field;
  - ❖ The date(s) and time(s) the application started and ended;
  - ❖ Restricted entry interval (REI);
  - ❖ Product name(s), U.S. EPA registration number(s), and active ingredient(s);
  - ❖ A copy of the Safety Data Sheet(s) for the applied pesticide(s); and
  - ❖ Spray adjuvant product name(s) and California registration number(s) if applicable.





## 3 CCR §6761.1 continued...

- ❖ The grower must display the ASI when they receive notice of a completed application and before any fieldworkers are allowed to enter the treated field
- ❖ A specific description of the location of the application-specific information must be included on or attached to the PSIS A-9 leaflet (must also be displayed)
- ❖ The ASI must stay displayed until the field no longer meets the definition of a treated field or workers will no longer be on the employer's property



## 3 CCR §6761.1 continued...

- ❖ The information required by this section must be retained for **two years**.
- ❖ The original or copies of documents otherwise required to be maintained by this chapter may be used to meet the requirements of this section, provided they contain the information required by this section.

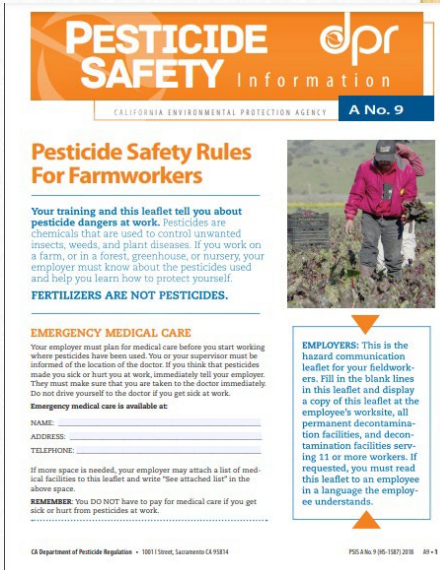

# 3 CCR §6761

- ❖ The employer (grower or Farm Labor Contractor [FLC]) is required to display a completed copy of the current Pesticide Safety Information Series (PSIS) A-9 leaflet:
- ❖ At the worksite or a central location where employees start their day
- ❖ At all permanent decontamination facilities
- ❖ Decontamination facilities servicing 11 or more fieldworkers
- ❖ Any changes to the medical information must be updated within 24 hours of the change
- ❖ Upon request, the employer must read the PSIS A-9 in a language the employee can understand



## 3 CCR §6761 continued...

- ❖ The grower must maintain pesticide use records and SDSs for pesticides that have been applied to the field within the last 2 years for each pesticide at a central location accessible to the grower or FLC employees
- ❖ The grower must inform employees (or the FLC who then must inform their employees) of the location of the records before the employees enter a treated field
- ❖ If the record location changes, the employer (grower or FLC) must promptly notify employees of the change
- ❖ Employees, their physicians, and their authorized representatives have the right to access any record, document, or information the grower or FLC is required to maintain under California's pesticide regulations.
- ❖ Employees are protected from discharge or discrimination for exercising their rights

# 3 CCR §6602

- ❖ Availability of labeling.
- ❖ Each use site must have available a copy of the registered labeling that allows the manner in which the pesticide is being used.



# Violations of 3 CCR §6602

### 3 CCR §6734

- ❖ The employer must provide the following decontamination supplies for handlers:
  - ❖ Soap\*
  - ❖ Three (3) gallons of clean water per handler at the start of the work day
  - ❖ Single use towels\*
  - ❖ Extra set of clean coveralls

**\*Hand sanitizing gels or liquids and wet towelettes do not meet this requirement**





## 3 CCR §6734 continued...

- ❖ The decontamination site must:
  - ❖ Be located at the mixing and loading site, AND not more than 1/4 mile away from other handlers. Multiple decontamination sites may be necessary, or applicators may need to carry decontamination supplies
  - ❖ Not be in an area being treated or under a Restricted Entry Interval (REI) unless certain precautions are taken
- ❖ Employees must be notified of the location(s) of the decontamination facilities prior to handling pesticides



## 3 CCR §6734 continued...



- ❖ Employers must provide emergency eye flush if protective eyewear is required by labeling, including:
- ❖ 1 pint of water for emergency eye flush must be immediately available to each applicator (carried by the applicator or on the application vehicle)
- ❖ At the mix and load site\*, there must be an emergency eye flush station able to gently rinse the eye for 15 minutes

**\*Eye flush must also be at the mixing/loading site if a closed mixing system is used**

## 3 CCR §6678

- ❖ All service containers are required to contain a label with the following:
  - ❖ Name and address of the person or company responsible for the container
  - ❖ The identity of the pesticide in the container
  - ❖ The signal word “Danger,” “Warning,” or “Caution” that corresponds with the precautionary statement on the original container
- ❖ Farmers on their own property are exempt from this requirement, unless they travel on public rights-of-way

- ❖ Registration shall be in the form prescribed by the commissioner and shall show the following information:
  - ❖ Name and address of pest control business
  - ❖ Number and kind of units to be operated in the county
  - ❖ Type of pests that are intended to be controlled
  - ❖ Any other information the commissioner may require

# 3 CCR §6726

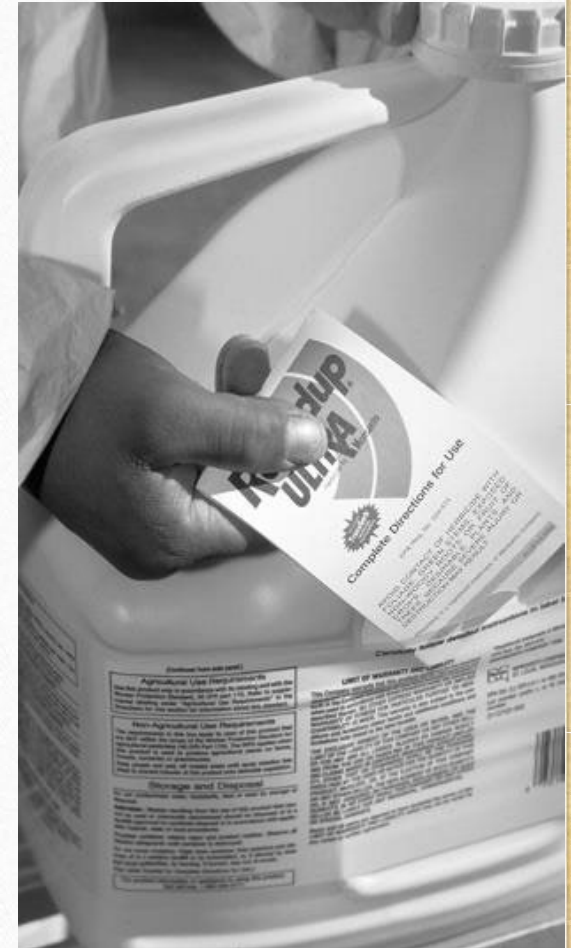
- ❖ Emergency medical care for employees handling pesticides must be planned in advance
- ❖ The name, address, and phone number of the medical facility must be posted at the work site or work vehicle when the employee handles pesticides





## 3 CCR §6726 continued...

- ❖ If the employer suspects that an employee could have a pesticide related illness or exposure, the employee must be taken to medical care immediately
- ❖ Be prepared to provide:
  - ❖ The SDS(s)
  - ❖ Product name(s), U.S. EPA registration number(s), and active ingredient(s)
  - ❖ Circumstances of application or use that may have resulted in exposure



# Violations of 3 CCR §6726

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**Example 1:** Not taking employees suspected of a pesticide illness to a medical care facility IMMEDIATELY

## 3 CCR §6738

❖ The employer is required to:

- ❖ Provide all personal protective equipment (PPE) that is required on the pesticide labeling, regulation, and restricted material permit condition
- ❖ Provide for its daily inspection and cleaning\*, and repair or replace any worn, damaged, or heavily contaminated PPE
- ❖ Assure that all PPE not in use is kept separate from personal clothing and in a clean, pesticide-free designated area

**\*Leather gloves used to apply only aluminum phosphide or magnesium phosphide pesticides which have been aerated for 12 hours or more are considered cleaned**





# 3 CCR §6738 continued...



- ❖ Assure that PPE is used correctly and for its intended purpose
- ❖ Keep and wash contaminated PPE separately from personal clothing or laundry
- ❖ Assure that all clean PPE is either dried thoroughly before being stored or is put in a well-ventilated place to dry
- ❖ Assure that PPE does not leave the employer's property\* and that employees do not take any uncleaned PPE into their homes
- ❖ Assure that anyone who cleans or repairs PPE is protected and informed

**\*Employees whose work day does not involve return to the employer's headquarters shall remove and store potentially contaminated PPE in a sealable container outside their own living quarters for later return to the employer**

# FAC §12973

- ❖ The use of a pesticide shall not conflict with:
- ❖ The registered labeling delivered with the pesticide, or
- ❖ Any conditions of a restricted material permit issued by the commissioner

All pesticides registered with U.S. EPA have the phrase **“It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.”**

In other words, **the label is the law.**
